6. CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAMME

We offer a varied Co-Curricular Programme comprising Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs), Student Leadership Programme, Enrichment and Lifeskills.

CCAs provide a platform to inculcate good character and values by providing every student with opportunities to develop skills and talents. There is a wide range of CCAs to match our students' interests and strengths while providing them with meaningful and enriching experiences. Every student must take part in one CCA and their attendance at scheduled sessions is **compulsory**. CCAs are conducted from 3 pm to 6 pm on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Should there be exceptions, your child will be informed accordingly¹. CCAs sessions for Sec 2 – 5 students will commence on 5 Jan 2023 while Sec 1 students will commence their CCAs on 14 Feb 2023. To develop thinking skills and a greater sense of ownership, we use a CCA Bidding process as the approach for our Sec 1s to select their CCAs. We will be sharing more on the CCA Bidding process during the Sec One Parent Engagement Session on 13 Jan 2023 (Fri) as well as through Parents Gateway.

Student Leadership Programme comprises 3 levels of student leadership development for different segments of student leaders (personal leadership, peer leadership and inspiring leadership). Opportunities for leadership development are supported by the 4A approach of Awareness, Actions, Assessment & review, and Affirmation of leadership competencies.

7. BLENDED LEARNING DAYS

Blended Learning aims to provide students a seamless blend of different modes of learning, with the intention to nurture self-directed and independent learners.

During Blended Learning Day, students would have dedicated time and space to learn at their own pace, explore their interests and learn outside the curriculum while doing home-based learning. All students would spend about 4 hours on curriculum coverage and the Secondary 1 to 3 students would also spend 1 hour on student-initiated learning. In Yuan Ching, our student-initiated learning programme is called DIVE (Developing Interests Via Exploration). Through DIVE, it is hoped that students can develop their intrinsic motivation to actively explore their interests, and come up with a plan on how they should go about pursuing them.

¹ For example, Scouts will have CCA sessions on alternate Fridays and, from 8.00 am to 12.15 pm on Saturdays.

Students who require but do not have appropriate supervision at home may return to school for supervised home-based learning.

8. NATIONAL DIGITAL LITERACY PROGRAMME & SEC 1 ICT PROGRAMMES

At MOE's Committee of Supply Debate in March 2020, MOE launched the National Digital Literacy Programme (NDLP) for our schools and Institutes of Higher Learning to help students strengthen their digital literacy. One of the components of the NDLP is the introduction of the Personalised Digital Learning Programme (PDLP) for all secondary school students, whereby every secondary school student will own a school-prescribed Personal Learning Device (PLD). Sec 1 students will be briefed during their orientation. Programme and procurement details will be communicated to the parents during the Sec 1 Parents Engagement Session on 13 Jan 2023 and via Parents Gateway.

In preparation for the NDLP and to ensure students are equipped with the essential ICT skills, all Sec 1 students will be required to complete a self-paced student certification for Google Workspace and participate in the National Digital Explorer (NDE) 2023. These programmes will equip them with key ICT skills and knowledge for self-directed lifelong learning. It also empowers the students to learn real-world skills that enable them to think critically and be more productive learners. More details of the respective individual programmes will be provided at a later date.

9. DIGITALISATION OF STUDENTS DETAIL FORM (SDF)

MOE will be rolling out the Student Details Form (SDF) to all parents/Legal Guardian (LG)/Authorised Caregiver (CG) from Tue, 3 Jan 2023. The SDF is the digitalisation of the Pupil Data Form (PDF) and the Individual Student Details Report (ISDR). With this roll-out, parents/LG do not need to need to verify details of student data via hardcopy. Parents/LG can provide both sets of data in one single session when he/she logins to the SDF portal. An announcement to ask parents/LG/Authorised CG to verify the data in the SDF will be sent via Parents Gateway (PG) by the Communications and Engagement Group (CEG) on 11 Jan 2023 (Wed). Parents are to complete the SDF on-line and submit via the SDF portal by 31 Jan 2023 (Tue).

10. SAFETY AWARENESS

Our staff and students' safety is of utmost importance and we would like to emphasise on safety and the importance of everyone's responsibility in ensuring safety in the school. For parents who are driving to drop off or pick up their children at school, do exercise patience and avoid overtaking within the narrow driveway at our school foyer. The speed limit within our school premises is 15km/h and we appreciate that this speed limit be adhered for the safety of our staff and students. For students who intend to cycle to school, parental consent is required and only LTA approved bicycles are allowed. We would also like to highlight that CCTVs are in operation in and around our premises to ensure school safety and security.

b. SEC 1 PARENT ENGAGEMENT SESSION CUM CCA SHOWCASE ON 13 JAN

The school is organising a Parents' Engagement Session for the Sec 1 parents on 13 Jan 2023 (Friday) from 5pm to 7:30pm in conjunction with the CCA Showcase from 3pm to 5pm. The CCA Showcase will give you and your child a sense of the range of CCAs that our school offers, so that you can better guide your child to make informed choices based on his/her interests, strengths and talents. During the engagement session with Form Teachers and engagement talks, you will gain a better understanding of the school's direction, the National Digital Literacy Programme, Co-Curricular Activities (CCA), as well as the key programmes lined up for Secondary 1.

c. SCHOOL SAFETY WEEK

In the pursuit of building a safety culture among staff and students, the school will be organising a School Safety Week in Term 1 Week 2, from 9 to 13 Jan 2023. The range of programmes prepared for our students are as follows:

I. Safety Briefing for Secondary 1 Students

Topics: Coming to school safely, School Traffic, Safety in Engaging Physical Activities, Lightning Alert System and School Emergency.

II. Road Safety Assembly Programme

To educate the importance of road safety and advocate road safety practices

With these programmes, we aim to do our part in creating a safe and secure environment that is conducive for learning for our students.

d. REMEDIAL LESSONS STARTING FROM 9 JAN

We believe in timely intervention and supporting our students in closing their learning gaps. Students will be identified for remedial lessons which are conducted on a weekly basis in the afternoons, starting on 9 Jan 2023. Parents will be informed via Parents Gateway (PG) if their child has been identified for remedial lessons.

The Daily Routines for Semester 1 will be disseminated to all students by Term 1 Week 1 Friday (6 Jan 2023). It provides details of the remedial lesson schedule, daily curriculum hours, CCA sessions and operating hours of the General Office. A copy of it will also be uploaded on the school website.

e. CHINESE NEW YEAR CELEBRATIONS CUM BLENDED LEARNING ON 20 JAN

The Chinese New Year Celebrations will take place on 20 Jan 2023 (Fri), to engage our students in a range of entertaining and meaningful activities. Students will learn more about Chinese traditions and cultural aspects through interactive games and hands-on activities.

To promote the spirit of sharing and caring for the less fortunate, we will be conducting a donation drive to collect food items and necessities which will be distributed to the elderly living in rental blocks at Taman Jurong after the Chinese New Year. We hope that you will weigh in your support to this meaningful activity.

20 Jan 2023 is not a half day as it is not Chinese New Year eve. However, the school has scheduled it as a Blended Learning Day, and students will report to school as usual and will return home for their blended learning after the Chinese New Year celebrations. More details will be given to the students closer to the event. We wish all Chinese parents and students a Happy and Prosperous Lunar New Year in advance.

f. WEIGHTED ASSESSMENT 1 STARTING FROM 6 FEB

Weighted Assessment 1 (WA1) will take place from 6 Feb - 3 Mar 2023. WA1 will assess students' academic learning progress in Term 1. We look forward to your support in supervising your child as he/she prepares for the Weighted Assessment 1.

12. STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT, RULES AND REGULATIONS

We believe that a positive school tone is crucial to our students' development. School rules state the school's expectations of student behaviour and conduct, both within and outside of school. It is important to start the year right by displaying exemplary conduct and cultivate good habits such as punctuality and attendance in school. All students must abide by the school rules and strive to uphold the school's good name.

All students are given a copy of the 2023 Student Handbook and Planner which they need to bring to school daily. A summary of our school rules is stated in the handbook. The full version can be found on our school website. Please take some time to familiarise yourself with the school rules so that together, we can provide a conducive environment that supports our students' learning and holistic development.

Do also take note of the policy on the use of mobile phones and personal learning device (PLD) in school. Unless permission is otherwise granted by the school, all mobile devices are to be placed in silent mode and kept out of sight during curriculum time/ remedial/ CCAs and can only be used in the school canteen after these activities. Non-adherence will result in confiscation of the mobile phone (including SIM card) for one week in the first instance.

Attendance in school is one of the basic predictive factors for learning, for students to experience a holistic education that develops the mind, ethics and social skills. Regular attendance in school is critical and our school takes a serious view of students' attendance. Students who are absent from school (during curriculum time and/or for afternoon programmes or CCAs) must produce a medical certificate upon their return to school. Letters from parents will only be accepted for exceptional cases.

13. **PARENT SUPPORT GROUP**

All parents of our students are invited to join the Parent Support Group (PSG). A strong partnership between the school and parents is critical to our students' development. The PSG has been actively involved in our school events and has provided invaluable support to both our

staff and students. The PSG also plays an important role in facilitating and coordinating Project PAiR (PArents Involved in Reading) which promotes reading among parents and children. In addition, PSG organises family-oriented activities to promote parent-child bonding and to create a strong sense of identity among PSG members.
